Parents/carers are advised it is now compulsory that all school volunteers/helpers have a current **Working with Children Check**.

- 1. Fill in the application form and verify your identity online
- 2. Check the email that will be sent to you with instructions on how to finalise your application at Australia Post
- 3. At Australia Post your photo will be taken at no charge to you.

#### **Student Safety:**

Parents are asked to remind their children to be very careful when walking or riding to and from school. I have received reports of used syringes left lying near footpaths and in nature strips

etc.

#### **OOSH Information:**

Did you know that the Red Cliffs Primary School Out of School Hours care (OOSH) program is open to all primary aged children. Parents do not have to be working to access the service.

Cost to use the service on a daily basis is extremely low. Cost to send one child to OOSH on the Pupil-Free day in March can be as low as \$5.00 and up to a maximum of less than \$20 for the day.

I encourage all parents to consider using OOSH on a regular basis.

1/2 & 2J - Plant parts and their functions - children make a sock man using a jar of water, socks, seed and soil.


**3/4** - Animal groupings - e.g. Reptiles, mammals etc. Their characteristics and habitats?
